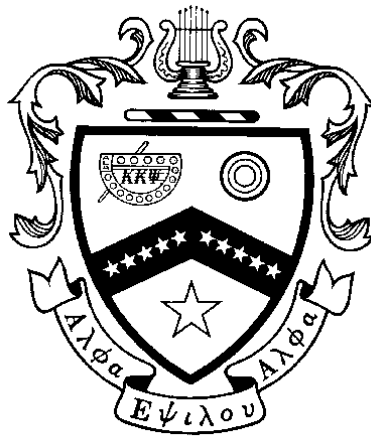

Eight years ago I stood in a very similar place, attending a District Convention at James Madison University. It was my first. I was young (fraternally), a little scared, and utterly overwhelmed. 6. Look to foster closer relations between the council and the district. Make sure the website, wherever the webmaster duties sit, is up to date and accurate.
7. Get your convention outline to Nationals on or before the deadline. We've been the very first for the past two years. Let's make that streak grow.
8. Finally, hound people on paperwork. We have too many amazing chapters to let them suffer as a result of submitting a CSR or FAR late.

The event went so smoothly and I was greatly impressed by the way our fraternity represented ourselves. Next, I was able to incorporate some traveling into my own marching band season. The brothers of UNH were so welcoming and let members of our band stay with them before our game the next day. I was pleased to be a part of Kutztown's band during one of their football games, and it was such a nice experience to sing behind the bleachers with them and Shippensburg during the third quarter. I also attended a few Rituals, where I am always learning new things. This helped to disprove the idea that no one is able to travel in the fall, and I tried to encourage more of this inter-chapter visiting.

The spring started off with a fun council meeting in January, and soon enough it seemed like I was hiking around every weekend to the precinct meetings. I know there are a few things that could have been improved, so I charge the next Member at Large with the following:

1. Find an online forum – wiggio or otherwise – that will work best for the district's individual officers. Corr Secs and Presidents should have ones, and maybe include other officers.
2. Add more structure to District Daze. Evaluate if the event is worthwhile, and try to add in workshops or something equivalent in order to raise attendance.
3. Spread awareness about awards. Make sure every chapter knows about the opportunities.
4. Investigate chapters that may have not been focused on by the Northeast District Council. This includes educating chapters that have previously missed paperwork about annual deadlines.

Appendix 1 – Keynote Speech, Carl Mead KKΨ-Epsilon Nu

Epsilon Nu and Delta Delta have a custom during band camp. We don't wear letters. We don't wear letters until the last day, and then everyone wears letters. I know some chapters do this too, and I know everyone else is saying, "Guys, what're you doing? You're missing out on this great recruiting opportunity."

Eh. Maybe. But that's not what it's all about. I mean think about it:

The first day of band camp, rookies are all meeting their section leaders and the student staff and the people that run the band. Then the next few days, there's still that same group of people that these guys are already getting to know, and they're the first vets whose names they all know. They notice us, they recognize us, and that's what it's about. And then on that last day, when we're all in letters, they say, "Wait. They're all Brothers? They're all Sisters?" They knew there was something about us, they knew we were the people in charge, but now they know who we are.

We set the example. We're the group that makes the band run. Through all our efforts, through all our service, it's us, and when we wear our letters they can see that. They can see that as we line the field and set up the ladders and load up the trucks.

But, let's face it, that's only half the example we set. Because, yeah, they see us all working and being diligent and all that, but what they see in us is that we're laughing as we do it. There is very little about being a member of a marching band that isn't hectic and stressful, but Brothers and Sisters laugh and smile through it all. As we set up a room in the Fine Arts Center for the Concert Band with only five minutes to work with, we laugh. Or as we guide prospective music majors around campus on audition days, we smile. Or as we serve cereal and bagels before a 7AM rehearsal, we laugh and smile then too. We set the example with our enthusiasm and leadership. Being a Brother or a Sister is more than being a bandmember, and more even than being a bandleader. Being a Brother or a Sister is about being the person all the other bandmembers can look to as an example not just of what to do, but how to do it. Don't just set up sound, enjoy it. Don't just stand in the rain waiting for a parade to start, get a game started. That's what we do, and that's what gets the band to do it too.

I don't want to spend too long on it, but this past fall, Epsilon Nu and Delta Delta experienced a tragedy that required just that sort of leadership and example. When our band director passed away, the whole band needed to stand together. And as I leaned on my Brothers and Sisters for support and as they leaned on me in return, the last thing on my mind was that we needed to set an example for the band with our strength. That wasn't the goal for me. For me the goal was to get through it, and that meant I needed my Brothers and Sisters, and that helped me cope. What I didn't know was that as I looked to my family, others in the band looked to us too. As we got back to work and ready to perform, rehearse, and travel that next day, the band got moving. As we got back to smiling and laughing and reminiscing after grieving and coping and crying over the course of that weekend, the band did too. The band moved by our example.

And that shouldn't even surprise me, really, because that's how it's always been. We'd start the game of Big Booty in the rain, waiting to step off in the parade, and the band joined in. We went to concerts in our letters and section by section, the audience grew. We did what we do, and the band moved by the example of our service. We don't wear our letters through band camp because what matters first is setting the example.

Appendix 3 – Final Report of the Northeast District Vice President, Rachel Dashnaw

Brothers of the Northeast District,

It has been an honor and a pleasure to serve as your District Vice President for the past year. This position, as some of you may or may not know, was vacant for a full term before I came to office. In addition, some changes prior to my election transformed the role of the Vice President from one that stressed colonization and membership to a position that right now seems like a conglomeration of unfinished ideas and outdated items. It has been my job, for the past year, to figure out exactly what the role of Vice President should be in future years. I'm pleased to say that I've come up with some new items that will help define the Vice President's role as that of a right-hand man (or woman) to the President.

My time as Vice President began with a trip to Lincoln University, where MariAnne and I witnessed the installation of their chapter. This event was truly special, as a feeling of brotherly love surrounded everyone in attendance, tying together multiple chapters by the creation of yet another group of dedicated bandmen. I have really enjoyed watching them grow and develop into a strong chapter this past year, and always look forward to hearing from them. Sadly, their installation meant that my advisement of a colony was short lived. And then, miraculously, another colony appeared on the horizon in early November, the colony at Robert Morris University! I was so excited to get back to work, this time to see the process from the beginning. I began my advisement by contacting their colony President, Brian Burns. We've had a lot of email correspondence since then, and I'm very happy to say that they seem to be on the right track, with a great advising chapter in Pitt, and wonderful sponsors. Although the road was initially rocky, with problems submitting paperwork, we've gotten the problem fixed and all is underway.

However, there are a few things I learned while speaking with Brian and his chapter that put the duties of the Vice President into perspective. I realized, through advising Brian, that I knew next to nothing about how the colonization process works, especially about how they instruct themselves during the membership education process. I believe this to be a weak point in our fraternity, that not enough resources are available for the colonies to feel confident in their own membership education. I would like to charge next year's Vice President to create a Membership Education Manual, working with both Lincoln and Robert Morris Universities, specifically designed to help colonies during their colonization process. I believe this would greatly benefit not only the colonies, but also the advising chapters and sponsors as they help to create a sense of brotherhood within those colonies.

Similarly, one of my duties as Vice President is to create/update a Post-Initiate Education program. This seems rather superfluous, as most chapters already partake in some form of PIE. What I presented in my Precinct workshop this past Spring was a presentation detailing the PIE program as suggested by the Membership Education Manual. I believe that having the Vice

President elaborate upon these suggested ideas would only be redundant, and may not necessarily help every chapter. The point of PIE is to educate and improve your chapter in your own unique way, and I believe many of you have enough of an established program that you are already accomplishing this, some of you unknowingly.

I think that my workshop accomplished what I had tried to achieve via email at the beginning of the fall semester: I successfully got many of you to share your chapter traditions and education programs with one another, and I hope all of you took something away from those workshops. I believe running a workshop where brothers share their PIE program concepts is far most successful than creating a manual based on my own personal experiences. This brotherhood is about all of us, and I wanted everyone to share a bit of their chapter with the rest of the district. I would highly encourage next year's Vice President to implement the same kind of workshop at Precinct Conventions next year, possibly widening the program to include something similar to TBS's "Student Chats."

As Vice President, I also figured out that I have some duties which are rather outdated, and some tasks I accomplished this year that aren't in my duties at all! I won't bore you with the outdated items (Jurisdiction Committee, get ready for some fun later!), but I will talk about some duties which I believe should be added to my position.

First, I put together the District Jazz Band forms for this year. Unfortunately, due to some miscommunications, the forms were posted rather late, and overall the concept was a flop and isn't going into effect this year. I want to charge next year's Vice President with stepping up their game in relation to this project, making forms available by the end of January at the latest, and working hard to publicize the opportunities afforded you all as participants in this group.

Second, it has come to my attention that the removal of outdated items from my duties will result in a great deal of disparity in the sheer amount of work required by each District Officer. I'd like to see the Jurisdiction Committee move the duties of Webmaster from Secretary/Treasurer to the Vice President.

Finally, do you guys know what you get when you become a District Officer? A great big box of stuff! Well, it took me a whole year to find mine, and I didn't get a lot of time to really accomplish my goals in relation to all this "stuff." The boxes are organized into things that needs to be Archived, and papers which the VP might find useful, but overall it still isn't very much fun to lug around a 30 pound box of papers. I would like to charge next year's VP AND THE REMAINING COUNCIL MEMBERS to work hard to digitize all your information. I think the investment of an external hard drive specifically for all the information we need as District Officers wouldn't be a bad idea either.

So now comes the part where I thank each and every one of you. I'm going to do this in reverse order. First, I want to thank every single brother in the Northeast District for everything you do--without you we wouldn't have an organization. For those of you who have been crazy enough to hang out with me, thanks for making my time as a District Officer enjoyable! Appendix 4 – Final Report of the Northeast District Alumni Association by Marcus Wyche

In the Opening Joint Session, and at the Senior Luncheon, most of you heard about what NEDAA does: the annual Keynote Speech Contest; Alumni Communication and Participation Awards; National Convention grants for NED delegates and NIB participants. These are ways in which we, as Alumni, serve as an additional resource to the Active membership and District.

NEDAA has talked about and is engaging in planning on how to take our service to the next level and beyond our primary activity in the Precinct/District season. Last October, for example, we had a display table at the Allentown Band Festival for the second year in a row. In our business meeting, we have worked out a game plan for improving operations (like getting our website back online), and have agreed upon upcoming initiatives to help you become familiar with our membership, and for our membership to be even more of a resource, and throughout the year.

All of this we are proud to do. And we hope that the other Local Alumni Associations are making themselves available as a resource. But whatever the situation may be with your Alumni, what exactly do we mean by “resource”? How much is enough, and how much is too much?

When asked, everyone will tell you Alumni are important to their chapters, and to the Fraternity and Sorority. It’s almost become a stock answer. But I ask that you consider this: Alumni may have wisdom and experience, and function as the National leadership, but does that not mean that you, the Active membership, are the lifeblood of the Fraternity and Sorority? Alumni offer ourselves to serve, but shouldn’t it be, in part, up to *you* to decide what place Alumni will have, and what place we will not have?

Alumni are older and more experienced, but it doesn’t mean we’re always right. Alumni can bring life and living history to a chapter, but sometimes they don’t know when they are overstepping their bounds. Alumni can advise the chapter, but they can’t run it.

The second point of the Preamble to NEDAA’s constitution states, “To Assist the Northeast District, local chapters, and the National Chapter with chapter visitations, expansion, revitalization efforts, and to act as advisors, but only if called upon by the local chapters, National Headquarters, District, or National Councils.” Implicit in this, I think, is that we are here as an additional resource, not a primary one. We look for you to show us what you need and how to serve you better, but acknowledge that we can only take you so far. So then the question that has to be asked, by everyone—Actives and Alumni—is “Where do Alumni fit in?”

There is no right or wrong answer to this question. And the answer may change as timing and circumstances dictate. But I think we should ask the question. For Actives, it will help them balance their priorities with working with their Alumni. For Alumni, it will help find our niche in relating to the Actives, individually and collectively.

What do you think?

Appendix 6 – Final Report of the Alumni Affairs Committee

Dearest Brethren of the North East District,

Throughout the duration of this convention, the Committee on Alumni and Historical Affairs has worked to the best of our abilities to complete the tasks and duties required; however, we, as a committee, have analyzed the requirements and found the duties both unachievable and impractical in this form. We, also, have found that the duties are not in the district's jurisdiction. For example, 9.30.a of the NED Constitution requires this Committee to review “the activities of the nationally recognized alumni affairs,” and 9.03.b “Examine, recommend, and submit to the District Convention all policy regarding expansion of the Life and Alumni Association membership,” which are both already accomplished by National operations.

On a more positive note, we analyzed the role of the of the historical archivist and alumni liaison (HAAL). The first part we considered was the title. Although the current title given is thorough, it's also impractical and cumbersome. We believe the name historian/alumni liaison (HAL) would be a lot simpler and still sum up the duties of this position. Along with the name change, we sent the jurisdiction committee a proposal to reword two sections for clarification of the HAAL.

in accordance with the charges from the 2010 convention and requests from the NED council, we “brainstormed” for “new ideas to promote a healthy transition from active membership to the alumni status, and to encourage individuals to alumni status, and to encourage individuals to keep contributing to the fraternity after graduating.” We figured mostly that this should be a chapter initiative, but through workshops or open forums this could enlighten and help chapters across the district to better their alumni relations and historian initiatives. Also, we briefly discussed a northeast district award that could be awarded to honor outstanding alumni across the district. Secondly, we asked to brainstorm ideas for NED 25th anniversary. We thought of making anniversary pins, NED specific workshops, and various NED events across the district, but we believe that these ideas more complete and better accomplished by the NED council. So, we charge the following:

To the Northeast District Council 2011-2012:

1. brainstorm and implement further ideas for 25th anniversary through personal ideas and asking for input from chapters across the ned.
2. Hold workshops geared towards alumni relations at districts and precincts.

To the HAAL and Awards Committee:

1. design an outstanding alumni award for the north-east district to honor the hard work and dedication of an outstanding alumnus in our district.

With much consideration and input from our advisers, national officers, and district officers, we have decided that this committee cannot accomplish anything worthwhile in its current format. We believe, in the best interest of the Northeast District, this committee should be dissolved. We find that the need for alumni and historical input would better be accomplished by a series of open forums and workshops at precincts and district convention. These open forums could encourage further input from both actives and alumni to provide a plethora of new ideas and help more individual chapters with transition from active to alumni status, alumni relations, and

encouraging life membership. These changes will be proposed under Jurisdiction. We truly believe that getting rid of this committee will allow for better use of our delegation and our time at districts.

Finally, thank you to our advisers Edward Savoy and Mike Osborn for all of their input and guidance which was extremely useful and led us to “think out of the box” to make our district more efficient. Also, major thanks to all alumni and representatives of NEDAA in attendance; their ideas are enlightening and indisputably important to the future of our fraternity. Thanks to Meghan Bowers for giving first hand input of the HAAL position, and clarifying the HAAL's duties. Then finally, thanks to all the delegates and brothers in attendance for their hard work and dedication. Keep Striving for the Highest!

Appendix 7 – Final Report of the Membership Education Committee

Brothers of the Nation's Elite District,

The Membership Education Committee was charged with examining the role of Big Brothers and discussing the Membership Education Process as a whole, as well as discussing the Post Initiate Education program and ways to facilitate inter-chapter discussion of Membership Education Programs and processes.

We began by reviewing the charges from last year's committee and used those as starting points for our discussions. We reviewed the Big Brother Oath, and determined that many chapters are not aware of its existence in the Membership Education Teaching Manual. We discussed different ways that chapters instill a sense of responsibility in Big Brothers for the wellbeing of their Little Brothers.

We also spent a good deal of time discussing obstacles chapters face with campus awareness of the fraternity and recruitment, and allowed open conversation with advice from other chapters regarding their successes in certain areas. Some ideas were fostering a bond with the Music Department as a whole, not just staying within the bands, and co-sponsoring campus events with other organizations, such as social fraternities or vocal groups. We concluded by creating a list of chapter problems and potential solutions, along with a list of recruitment ideas.

Lastly, we discussed the relevance of having a Membership Education Committee, and determined that the committee should be dissolved, and that the time would be better spent in Membership Education round table discussions and workshops. These workshops could be facilitated by the district Vice President, who could contribute his or her knowledge of MEP and PIE programs in the district. We felt that the discussions we had during the meeting would have been more beneficial had we not felt obligated to cut short discussions to move on to the next charge. The committee also discussed the need for a consolidated online forum where specific chapter officers could converse about their duties and the best way to go about bettering that aspect of their chapters. This would be especially valuable to VPMs who are seeking advice on how to handle changing aspects of their chapters MEP programs

We charge the District Council with the following:

1. Examine the necessity of the Membership Education Committee, and consider disbanding the committee, in favor of having Membership Education open discussions and workshops instead.
 - a. These workshops and discussions would be closed (brothers only), and could potentially be facilitated by the District Vice President.
 - b. Have next year's committee meet only during the first committee block for a round table discussion, and have Membership Education workshops during the two other committee meeting times.
2. Work with the National Council to examine different online forums available to foster inter-chapter discussion specific to certain offices, especially Vice Presidents of Membership, and to publicize this resource to all chapters.
 - a. There are currently forums on the National website, and many other host sites, but there is a definitive need for a consolidated location for these discussions.

We charge the Jurisdiction Committee with the following:

1. Change the District Constitution section 9.07 so that the Membership Education Committee is closed (brothers only)
 - a. If the Membership Education Committee is dissolved, this charge is irrelevant

We charge the 2012 Membership Education Committee with the following:

1. Create an environment that fosters open but constructive discussion of the MEP and PIE programs at different chapters in the district. Do not allow this to be a venting session, but rather encourage chapters to give suggestions to help other chapters struggling with specific aspects of Membership Education.
2. Charge the District Council to examine the need for the Membership Education Committee.
3. Work with the District Vice President to host Membership Education workshops or discussions in lieu of formal committee meetings.
4. Create charges for the 2013 Membership Education Committee to encourage a similar environment of open discussion.

Appendix 8 – Final Report of the Finance Committee

Brothers of the Northeast District,

This year's committee was charged with the following:

- Complete constitutional guidelines as pertaining to the Finance Committee.
- Review the budget for the next operating year as presented by the District Secretary Treasurer, submitting additions, deletions, and modifications as necessary, and then presenting this budget to the current Convention.
- Review guidelines chosen by the Council for the Chapter Travel Reimbursement Program and develop concrete guidelines to be used early.
- Discuss adding the Chapter Travel Reimbursement Program to the NED Constitution.
- Discuss a Travel Reimbursement for National Convention.
- Brainstorm other worthwhile ideas for the District to fund.
- Brainstorm District fundraisers or discuss the feasibility of such initiatives in general.

Using the charges as a guide the committee reviewed the expenditures of the 2010-2011 NED officers to be within the budget approved by the 2010 Delegation. This year's committee has reviewed the proposed 2011-2012 budget as prepared by Nic Rorrer, current NED Secretary Treasurer, and has prepared the following budget for the 2011-2012 year. The following is the opening budget and the operating income for the next convention year.

This year's committee discussed several different ways in which to improve the usage of the money currently sitting in the NED bank account. The committee found that the Chapter Travel Reimbursement process was well used this past convention season, and would like to remind chapters that need assistance traveling to precincts and districts that money is available for assistance. The finance committee made one addition to the proposed budget, the addition of \$1,000 to be made available, every 2 years, for Brothers accepted to play in the NIB at National Convention. The following stipulations have been assigned to this reimbursement request.

1. Applications are due 2 weeks after the NIB roster has been published.
2. The District Council and Governors will collectively decide who gets a grant and for how much using any combination of the following criteria.
 - a. Chapter's distance from the convention site
 - b. The number of Brothers planning to attend
 - c. Chapter financials (budget for the year)

- d. Does the chapter subsidize travel?
 - e. Chapter's attendance history at District and National events.
 - f. Are there any extenuating circumstances?
3. After the close of National Convention, the receiving individual has 30 days to submit receipts of all chapter convention costs to the NED Secretary/Treasurer.

It is the hope of this committee that this reimbursement system will make playing in the NIB a more viable option for all Brothers in the NED. Officer budgets were cut by 50 % for President, Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer, and HAAL; with reasoning being that with increased email, website, and listerv utilization that money previously set aside for mailings to chapters is no longer needed. For this same reason the MAL budget was increased \$25 to \$125. Note that several years ago the NED did a large amount of Fundraising for a piece of work to be commissioned. In celebration of the 25th Anniversary of the NED a work will be commissioned for \$6,000. This is to only be included in the budget for the next year.

Total Expenses next year, is estimated at \$14,525.00. With the income provided the estimated account closing at next year's convention will be \$10,980.00 assuming that you the Brothers of the NED take full advantage of all funding opportunities in: Chapter Travel Reimbursement, NIB Travel Reimbursement, the matching Commissioned Works Grant for purchasing and playing of a commissioned work of Kappa Kappa Psi.

The committee deemed that fundraising ventures were much better suited to assist individual chapters, and provide direct support at the university level than fundraise for the NED. After all a portion of our dues each fall gets directed to the NED, assuming that each chapter fills out on time the Chapter Personnel Update.

The committee leaves these charges for next year's Finance Committee:

- Complete constitutional guidelines as pertaining to the Finance Committee.
- Review the budget for the next operating year as presented by the District Secretary Treasurer, submitting additions, deletions, and modifications as necessary, and then presenting this budget to the current Convention.
- Brainstorm other worthwhile programs for the district to fund, such as travel to Rituals and Installations or scholarship for Brothers participating in DCI, DCA.

The committee leaves these charges for next year's District Secretary/Treasurer:

- Place the Chapter Travel Reimbursement form on the NED website.
- Create a Commissioned Work Reimbursement Form and place on the NED website; refer to the national form if needed.
- Create an NIB Travel Reimbursement form using the Chapter Travel Reimbursement form and the outline given in the report as a guide.
- Ensure that with new programs and the 25th anniversary commissioning project that the NED bank account stays at a desirable level.

I'd like to take this opportunity to thank you all for the chance to serve as the chair of the Northeast District's Committee on Finance. It was great to be able to work with the Brothers on preparing the budget and discussing the financial future of the district. I would like to thank the delegates from: Epsilon Nu, Eta Gamma, Eta Omega, Kappa Gamma, Mu Epsilon, Mu Nu, Colony members from Robert Morris, and the other brothers who attended. I would like to thank committee advisor Ben Soltoff, and current Secretary Treasurer Nic Rorrer. Finally I would like to thank the Brothers of Eta Beta: it has been a long and great six years. I wish you and the rest of the brothers of the Northeast District the best.

Appendix 11 – Final Report of the Jurisdiction Committee

Discussion of reorganizing 7.07 (Candidacy requirements):

There have been issues with the clarity of the section and it has been suggested that separating the requirements in the form of bullet points will aid applicants. The committee agrees.

The proposed changes are to strike section 7.07 and insert a new section 7.07 that reads as follows:

7.07 Potential candidates for district office are required to submit by opening gavel of first separate session five (5) packets that must contain the following:

- 1. A cover letter*
- 2. A resume*
- 3. A list of goals and plans to meet them*
- 4. Letters of recommendation from each of*
- 5. The Chapter Sponsor*
- 6. The Director of Bands*
- 7. The Chapter*
- 8. Proof of Active or Associate membership in good standing*
- 9. Any other supporting documents*

In addition, one (1) copy of the official transcript must also be submitted to the District Secretary/Treasurer. This transcript must reflect a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on the 4.0 scale and/or a C+ on the letter grade scale as well as current enrollment in a declared or undeclared full-time degree program. The District Secretary/Treasurer shall then distribute these materials to the chair of the Nominations committee. Potential candidates for District Office who are unable to meet this deadline may petition the District Governor(s) for exemption.

Discussion of responsibilities of Vice President (7.03):

The office of the Vice President has undergone many changes in recent years and it has been suggested that the description of duties should be updated in order to make it consistent with the current vision of the role of the District Vice President and to better distribute the workload among the District Council. The current District Vice President, Rachel Dashnaw, shared her experiences and suggestions.

The proposed changes are to strike 7.03-c; re-enumerate 7.03-e as 7.03-c; re-enumerate 7.03-h as 7.03-e; strike 7.03-f; insert a new 7.03-f reading, “Acting as the official Webmaster of the District”; strike 7.03-f; insert a new 7.03-g reading, “Preparing materials for the District Jazz Band and Student Conductor Workshops at District Convention within two (2) weeks of the close of winter council.”; strike 7.03-i. The proposed 7.03 reads:

7.03 The District Vice President’s duties shall be:

- a. Acting as the presiding officer of the District in the absence of the District President.*
- b. Acting as an advisor to new and rebuilding Chapters in the District.*
- c. Contacting each Northeast District colony, Advising Chapter, and Advising Person(s) at least once a month throughout the colonization process.*

- d. Informing all colonies in the Northeast District of the District Convention site, accommodations, and pertinent information.*
- e. Constructing and updating a publication of a suggested Post-Initiate Education Program annually and distributing digital or hard copies to the chapter delegates at the District Convention.*

f. Acting as the official Webmaster of the District

- g. Preparing materials for the District Jazz Band and Student Conductor Workshops at District Convention within two (2) weeks of the close of winter council.*

Since appointing a Webmaster is currently listed as a presidential responsibility, and since that job has been proposed to be done by the District Vice President, the committee discussed and proposes striking 7.02-k

Discussion of officer articles in Northeast Notes (strike from each individual officer):
As section 7.10-d specifies submitting an article to the Northeast Notes for all officers, sections: 7.02-m, 7.04-l, 7.05-i, 7.06-l are redundant. (Note that 7.03-i was proposed to be stricken in previous discussion.)

Discussion of general officer duties:

Specific requirements and duties of the District Council were discussed and expressed in two new sub-sections.

The proposed changes are to append section 7.10-e, reading, “Assist Chapters in utilizing National Resources related to his or her office.”; append the contents of 7.13 as a new section 7.10-f; strike section 7.13; renumber subsequent sections appropriately. The proposed 7.10 reads as follows:

- 7.10 During his or her entire term of office, each District Officer shall:*
 - a. Be responsible for maintaining a cumulative GPA of at least 2.5 on the 4.0 scale and/or a C+ on the letter grade scale.*
 - b. Be an Active or Associate member of a Chapter in good standing of the Fraternity.*
 - c. Be active and enrolled in a college or university full-time, undergraduate or graduate degree program within the boundaries of the District.*
 - d. Submit one (1) article to Northeast Notes per publication.*
 - e. Assist Chapters in utilizing National Resources related to his or her office.*
 - f. Each District Officer shall communicate with the Chapters and colonies of the District at least once every two (2) months.*

Where section 7.16 deals with a specific responsibility of the District Vice President, the committee discussed moving it to a subsection of 7.03 (Vice Presidential duties). Since 7.03-a and 7.16 deal with related situations, the committee recommends combining the two.

The proposed changes are to append, “, and filling a vacancy in the office of District President.” to 7.03-a; strike 7.16; and renumber the following sections appropriately. The proposed 7.03-a reads:

- 7.03 The District Vice President’s duties shall be:*
 - a. Acting as the presiding officer of the District in the absence of the District President, and filling a vacancy in the office of District President.*

Similarly, section 7.15 deals with a specific responsibility of the District President, the committee discussed moving it to a subsection of 7.02 (Presidential duties). It was also noted that the current section 7.02-l deals with the website and should also be stricken, as was section 7.02-k. Section The proposed changes are to insert a new 7.02-g, reading “Should any District Office, other than that of President, become vacant for any reason, the District President shall appoint a replacement officer.”; strike section 7.15; and renumber the following sections appropriately. The proposed 7.02 now reads as follows (including previously discussed amendments):

7.02 The district President’s duties shall be:

- a. Presiding over all meetings of the District.*
- b. Serving as a seated and voting member of the National Chapter of Kappa Kappa Psi at the National Convention.*
- c. Serving as a member ex-officio of all District Committees.*
- d. Rendering all possible service to the District Governor(s).*
- e. Acting in the absence of the District Governor(s) as the official representative of the District whenever such representation shall be required.*
- f. Distributing the materials list in Part I, Sections 8.02 and 8.03 of this Constitution to the appropriate District Council members by December 31.*
- h. Should any District Office, other than that of President, become vacant for any reason, the District President shall appoint a replacement officer.*
- i. Having the option of appointing a non-biased member to act as Parliamentarian at the District Convention.*
- j. Providing a form to every Chapter in the District two (2) months prior to District Convention. The form shall require the Chapters to list:*
 - 1. The name of the Chapter delegate.*
 - 2. The name(s) of the Chapter alternate delegate(s), if any,*
 - 3. The three (3) most desirable committees for the Chapter’s delegate, alternate delegate(s), and/or written proxy to be seated on, in order of preference.*
 - 4. The name of another Chapter to act as written proxy.*
- k. Contacting, by telephone, two (2) weeks prior to the District Convention, those Chapters not returning the delegate form (See Part I, Section 7.02h of the Northeast District Constitution) and urging those Chapters to designate a written proxy.*
- l. Sending postal or electronic mail to every Chapter in the District two (2) weeks prior to District Convention listing:*
 - 1. The Chapter(s) to be represented by proxy.*
 - 2. The Committees the Chapter’s delegate, alternate delegate(s), or written proxy shall chair, if any.*

Discussion of renumbering District Council meeting requirement/individual officer responsibilities

It was suggested the section 7.17 (District Council meeting requirement) should come before the individual officer responsibilities. The committee concurs and proposes that section 7.17 be renumbered 7.10 and all sections from 7.10 on be renumbered appropriately.

Proposals by current District Secretary/Treasurer, Nicholas Rorrer:

Current District Secretary/Treasurer, Nicholas Rorrer, presented his idea for a continuity clause. He proposed a new 7.15 reading “In the case that there is a vacancy

in a District Office, the previous District Officer shall serve until June 1st or until a replacement officer is appointed.” The issue of an officer desiring to leave office or other scenarios was discussed and a new wording was found. The proposed 7.15 reads as follows:

7.15 In the event that there is a vacancy in a District Office, the previous District Officer shall be eligible to serve at the discretion of the District Governor(s) until the first of 1) June 1 or 2) a replacement officer is appointed.

He also proposed striking section 13.03. Section 13.03 reads as follows:

The intent of this section was to encourage the officers to stay with brothers at chapters they were visiting, but it also had the effect of putting an undue financial burden on the District Officers. Nicholas Rorrer informed the committee that since the Northeast District is “tall,” it is desirable to break long trips into two parts with a night in a hotel. The issue of hotel cost/extra expense was raised. It was noted that the District budget and Committee on Finance would take care of that. The committee agreed to striking 13.03 and renumbering the following sections appropriately.

Proposals by Meghan Bowers, current District Historical Archivist and Alumni Liaison: Current District Historical Archivist and Alumni Liaison (HAAL), Meghan Bowers, presented the changes suggested by the Alumni and Historical Affairs Committee (AHAC). The AHAC procedure was summarized and their reasoning explained. The work assigned the committee is mainly infeasible over a weekend; should be a continuous process and not just at convention; and/or should be done by everyone, not just the AHAC or the District HAAL. Discussion about the formation of a forum to replace certain aspects of what is currently the AHAC’s work. The committee concurs and suggests striking section 9.03, renumbering the following sub-sections appropriately, and striking “Alumni and Historical Affairs,” from section 9.01, The proposed 9.01 reads:

9.01 The Committees of the District shall be the following: Awards, Finance, Jurisdiction, Membership Education, and Nominations, which shall meet separately. Convention Site and Publications shall meet jointly with Tau Beta Sigma.

Meghan Bowers suggests that the title of the District Officer, “Historical Archivist and Alumni Liaison” be changed to “Historian/Alumni Liaison.” The committee agrees. The following changes are proposed: change 7.01 and 7.06 to affect the title change.

The proposed section 7.01 reads as follows:

7.01 The District shall be under the jurisdiction of the District Governor(s), appointed by the National Council. In addition, the District shall have a District President, District Vice President, District Secretary/Treasurer, District Member-at-Large, and District Historian/Alumni Liaison.

The proposed section 7.06 (excluding sub-sections) reads as follows:

7.06 The District Historian/Alumni Liaison’s duties shall be:

It was suggested that the description of the HAAL’s (Historian/Alumni Liaison’s) duties could be reworked for clarity. The committee agrees. Since the AHAC was

proposed to be stricken, sub-section 7.06-d is obsolete. The discussion returned to the duties of the committee and incorporating them into the HAAL's (Historian/Alumni Liaison's) duties.

The proposed sub-section 7.06-d reads as follows:

- d. Creating activities to educate and inform members about alumni associations at NED Convention and throughout the year.

Discussion about "Letters of Intent":

It was suggested that criteria involving "letters of intent" be added to the process of submitting bids for hosting a District Convention, hosting a Precinct Meeting, or running for district office. The committee discussed the purpose of such a letter and the logistics and history of such a requirement. The committee deems that such letters and requirements are unnecessary. Grammatical error and potential situational discrepancy was discovered in the section describing bids for hosting District Convention. Sub-section

The proposed sub-section 11.02-b reads as follows:

- b. A letter from each sponsor of the bidding chapter or chapters.

Charges for next year:

- Work with the NED Vice-President to re-evaluate the duties and responsibilities as set this year.
- Evaluate the impact of striking 13.03 with the Committee on Finance
- Complete constitutional guidelines as pertaining to the Jurisdictions committee
- Complete the Constitutional Guidelines as set forth by section 9.07
